There is a greater likelihood that the mother has misinterpreted Tom's behaviours in a more sinister way rather than as a normal and child sexual developmental stage of interest in his body. Apart from the

(n) any other matter which is considered relevant to the psychiatric/psychological, social or emotional wellbeing of the child.

The negative opinion that the mother has of the father may be understandably exacerbated by his abandonment of contact with his son. It would be helpful if she could gain some insight and take some responsibility for her role in how this state of affairs has come about. It will be more beneficial for Tom in later years not to feel that his father was a bad person who simply abandoned him but to realise that there was a (possibly misguided) belief on his father's part that it was too difficult for Tom as well as for him.

Excerpts from DCP letter. Full DCP letter of exoneration is also attached.

As you are aware the Department for Child Protection has an open case with regards to your son Tom. I am writing to inform you of the outcome of this investigation. The Department has found that concerns in relation to the sexual abuse of Tom can not be substantiated and therefore the case will now be closed.

Given you denied harming Tom in a conversation that took place via telephone on the 7th June 2010, there is no need for you to attend the Department to meet with me in person.
